

Major change for 2019

George Washington's Birthday Observance moved to a luncheon

The 2019 George Washington's Birthday Observance will be a Saturday, Feb. 23 noon luncheon at the 94th Aero Squadron on Sawyer Road, just east of John Glenn Columbus Airport.

This annual event gives members of our SAR chapter and members of several local DAR chapters the opportunity to honor and learn about George Washington.

Our speaker for the event, Dr. Mary Stockwell, retired professor from Lourdes University in Sylvania, Ohio, will look at "Mad" Anthony Wayne, the Revolutionary War General on whom Washington was able to depend during several battles.

Eleven years after the War, President George Washington called on his old and trusted friend to come out of retirement and succeed where two other Generals had failed -- defeat the coalition of Indian tribes whose vicious attacks and massacres had made the Ohio Territory entirely too dangerous to be settled.

In 1784, Wayne led his well trained army from Cincinnati north to build and staff Fort Recovery.

He then proceded farther north

to where he decisively defeated the Indian coalition at the Battle of Fallen Timbers, which led to the Greenville Treaty and the opening up of Ohio for settlement.

Dr. Stockwell will look at the traits that made Wayne such a successful commander and also share insights into the relationship between this imperfect hero and both General Washington and and President Washington.

On January 15, the Benjamin Franklin Chapter participated in the Wreaths Across America ceremony, during which graves of veterans nationwide were honored with a wreath.

Hosted by the Worthington Chapter of the DAR, the event decorated three Worthington cemeteries -- Flint Road, Walnut Grove, and Saint Thomas Episcopal Church; the last of which includes the graves of two Revolutionary War veterans.

Prior to the grave decoration, a patriot ceremony was presented in the basement of Worthington Presbyterian Church that honored all of our nation's veterans.
